R.I.P Alan Rickman



Alan Rickman died of the pancreatic cancer on 14th January 2016 at the age of 69.

He was born in Acton, London, on 20th February 1946 from a working-class family: he trained at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art in London where he was member of the Corte Drama Group: he is one of the greatest british actors and he won many prizes.

«A beautiful actor and a fantastic person» say the most of the people who met him, included J. K. Rowling thanks to whom he could play in the *Harry Potter* saga and got to succes. The character of Severus Snape, the teacher of potions at Hogwarts school of witchcraft and wizardry, is the most famous his role.

Snape is a character that must be analized: a men who fights for love and never loses the hope, until the end, an important example for everyone.

He says: «When I'm 80 years old and sitting in my rocking chair, I'll be reading *Harry Potter* and my family will tell me: "After all this time?" and I will say: "ALWAYS"».

«We saw you die in the fiction but we were not ready for your real dead».

«Bye Alan, we will miss you, it's difficult to find the words. It seems we lost a grandfather. You left a sign during our childhood: the most brave man we have "known". Thank you to have been Severus. We love you. Rest in peace. With love, potterheads»

A limerick is a form of poetry, nonsense, based on an AABBA scheme.

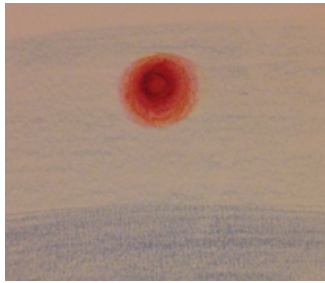
The form appeared in Ireland in the early years of the 18th century, exactly in the city of Limerick from which the name derives.

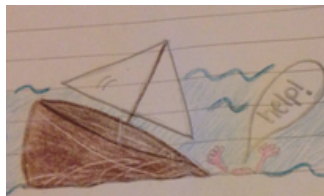
The wave told the sun
